Masters in History with Certification to Teach Social Studies

Complete 30 credits of graduate work, of which at least 21 credits must be in history. The graduate level history credits must include the following:

- (3 credits) Students in their first semester will take "The Art and Craft of Innovative History."
- (9 credits) Three reading seminars: With the approval of the Chair of the Graduate Studies Committee, a HIST666 component of an undergraduate lecture course may count as a reading seminar. Such approval will be given only when a HIST666 component includes regular "mini-seminar" meetings to discuss graduate- level readings.
 - (6 credits) one 800-level History Writing seminar; one 600-level capstone thesis project (HIST692/693)
 - Complete 10 additional program credits, including HIST492 (1 credit); EDUC420 (3 credits); and EDUC400 (6 credit student teaching practicum)
