Dr. Bay chronicles a people in motion over more than a century of transformative social and technological change. The talk will highlight the inequities of traveling black and African American struggles for freedom of movement, as well as Dr. Bay's research and writing process and challenges.*

Mia Bay is the Roy F. and Jeanette P. Nichols Professor of American History at the University of Pennsylvania.

She is a scholar of US and African American intellectual, cultural, and social history, including black women's thought and approaches to citizenship.
