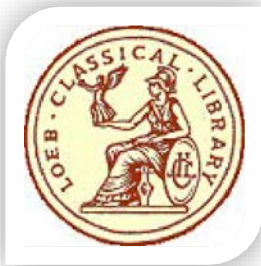
E-TEXT COLLECTIONS



[ACLS Humanities E-Book \(HEB\) Collection](#) is “an online collection of nearly 4,700 books published across the entire range of the humanities. Fields currently covered include: African History, American History, Archaeology, Art and Architectural History, Asian History, Australasian/Oceanian History, Biblical Studies, Bibliographic Studies, Byzantine History, Canadian History, Caribbean History, Central European History, Comparative/World, Eastern European/Russian History, Economic History, Environmental Studies, European History, Film and Media Studies, Hip Hop Studies, Jewish Studies, Latin American History, LGBT/Queer Studies, Middle Eastern History, Native Peoples of the Americas, Political Science, Religion, Sociology, Women’s Studies and more. Publication dates are from 1857 to recent years, although most are from the 1970s onward. Individual titles are accessible through DELCAT Discovery.



[Cambridge Histories Online](#) provides access to a package of books that includes about 30 titles that focus primarily on American history or general world history. Access specific titles by searching DELCAT Discovery using the exact title. For example, [Cambridge World History](#), [Cambridge History of the First World War](#) or [New Cambridge History of Islam](#). You can also search the [Cambridge Histories website](#), then select the filter “Only show content I have access to.”



The digital [Loeb Classical Library](#) extends the founding mission of James Loeb with an interconnected, fully searchable, perpetually growing virtual library of all that is important in Greek and Latin literature. The resource includes up-to-date texts and accurate English translations with more than 520 volumes of Latin, Greek, and English texts. Individual titles are accessible through DELCAT Discovery.

HISTORICAL STATISTICS



The archive of [Statistical Abstracts of the United States](#) covers 1878-2012 and supplements the current file that runs to the present. Total coverage is 1878-2016. This source provides statistical tables and charts covering various aspects of social, political, and economic life. Emphasis is on the United States, but some tables cover regions, states, cities, and comparative international statistics.

Information is gathered from all agencies of the federal government and from private, commercial, and professional sources. Most data are presented in time series and include the most recent year available at time of publication. You can download both the .pdf and .xls versions of tables from the archive. Access to the archives is through the current interface. Click on the **Edition** pull down menu to select the relevant date.

JOURNAL INDEXES



The [ATLA Religion Database](#) is an index to journal articles, book reviews, and collections of essays in all fields of religion, including Bible, archaeology, and antiquities; human culture and society; church history, missions, and ecumenism; pastoral ministry; world religions and religious studies; theology, philosophy and ethics. Journals are selected for inclusion according to their scholarly merit and scope. Coverage is from 1949 to the present, with retrospective indexing for some journal issues as far back as the nineteenth century. Use **Get It!** links to access the full text of articles.

JOURNAL INDEXES (CONT.)



[Index to Jewish Periodicals](#) covers more than 200 journals, including many of the most prominent titles covering Jewish culture, history, literature, religion and other areas of related study. Dates of inclusion are from 1988 to the present. Use **Get It!** links to access the full text of articles.



[L'Année Philologique](#) indexes Greek and Latin literature and linguistics and includes: early Christian texts and patristics, Greek and Roman history, art, archaeology, philosophy, religion, mythology, music, science, and scholarly subspecialties such as numismatics, papyrology and epigraphy. Indexing of books and journals is from 1924 to the present. Use **Get It!** links to access the full text of articles.

STREAMING VIDEO



[AVON: Academic Video Online](#) is a multidisciplinary collection of more than 50,000 videos spanning numerous subject areas including: anthropology, business, counseling, history, music, film, and more. Of especial interest to historians are: [60 Minutes: 1997-2014](#) (streaming video of the television program “60 Minutes”), [American History in Video](#) (newsreels and documentaries for the study of American history), [The March of Time](#) (video of Time Inc.’s unique and controversial film series, “The March of Time from 1935-1967”), [World Newsreels Online](#) (international newsreels produced during the early twentieth century) and many more individual collections.



[Docuseek2 Complete Collection](#) provides exclusive educational streaming video from Bullfrog Films, Collective Eye Films, Icarus Films (including The Fanlight Collection and dGenerate Films), Kartemquin Films, Sincerely Films, Terra Nova Films and Villon Films. Documentaries cover a wide range of topics pertaining to American and world history.

SCHOLARS' TOOLS



[BrowZine](#) is a tool that allows you to browse, read and follow journals on tablets, phones, and on the web. It consolidates thousands of the Library's subscribed scholarly journals, allowing you to read and browse issues through a single interface rather than looking up each journal individually. With BrowZine, you can:

- Browse and read e-journals: Browse journals by subject, easily review tables of contents, and download full articles
- Create your own bookshelf: Add journals to your personal bookshelf and be notified when new articles are published
- Save and export articles: Save articles for off-line reading or export to services such as DropBox, Mendeley, [RefWorks](#), Zotero, Papers and more
